## ARRIVAL TO MIAMI

On Wednesday 28th of November, John Rick Miller arrived at Miami and was immediately taken to Mercy Hospital to briefly visit with a member of the Mission that had found herself in a delicate health situation. He met for lunch with a group of men that are also active members of the Mission to discuss some important ideas regarding their involvement in South Florida.

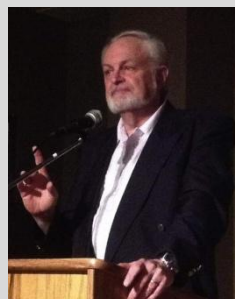
## SAINT MARTHA CHURCH

In the evening, his South Florida tour began with a talk at Saint Martha's Church, located in the Archdiocese of Miami, Miami Shores, where Fr. Wilfredo Contreras, of Dominican descent, introduced John Rick Miller with great joy and strong support of the Mission's work worldwide. In his message, John Rick spoke about how our hearts are inscribed with the 10 words of God – the Ten Commandments – and that we need to open our hearts and call our Father from that place, so that he can help us understand who we are and understand that we are His children.



## SAINT BERNADETTE CATHOLIC CHURCH

On Thursday 29th of November, John Rick Miller gave a talk at Saint Bernadette, located in the city of Hollywood, a parish that was consecrated this past October to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, with an attendance of over 1,200 faithful. In this talk John Rick Miller spoke about how today's world is obsessed with idolizing false gods and how there is much confusion. In the world today, what is evil is being accepted as what is good and we are removing the name of God from all parts of our lives. Society is becoming secular, but we can't have a future if it is without God.



## SANTA MARIA RADIO

This same evening, Fr. Alvaro Pinzon (Director of Saint Mary Radio, Judge of the Ecclesiastic Court of the Archdiocese of Miami and Director of the Brotherhood of Chiquinquira) invited John Rick Miller to tape two programs on Santa Maria Radio, which is a local station that is situated in the offices of the Archdiocese of Miami and carries the message of our Blessed Pope John Paul II and how, under the blessing of the Holy Spirit, renewed and strengthened faith, emotions and health and the understanding of all baptized Catholics, fulfilling the mandate of Jesus Christ. ## TALK TO PRAYER GROUPS



On Thursday the 30th of November, we began the day with a talk to prayer groups and also many people who had come to hear John Rick Miller for the first time, who left with great enthusiasm in forming prayer cenacles, both in South Florida and in their countries of origin. With an attendance of over 50 people, the message of John Rick Miller focused on conversion. He spoke of his own personal conversion and that there is no time to wait for others to change. The only person that is able to change is oneself and we must cease from blaming others. He also spoke about the importance of rebuilding the Catholic communities. In London, it is not uncommon to discover a cadaver of an elderly person well after death because they knew no neighbors. We are no longer sensitive to the suffering and the needs of others.

## MEETING WITH THE MAYOR

At mid-day, John Rick Miller and a few members of the Mission had a meeting with one of the Region's top politicians that was highly productive. It is blessing that there are many in power who firmly have God in their hearts and who are not afraid to open their official meetings with a prayer.

## TALK TO TEENS

In the afternoon, we had a meeting with 50 teens, whose parents made the effort to bring them to this meeting on time and in spite of traffic and other school activities. John Rick Miller spoke about a case in London of collective suicide and how the youth Europe have no reason to live, how they don't know God. Technology is stealing our time and there is now no time to pray, no time to be with family; we have allowed the enemy of God to entire our homes and he is penetrating our walls like glue. In this talk we also had a young guest who gave a testimony of her own conversion, wherein she reiterated that evil will always be evil, and can never be good, and that all adolescents live in constant temptation, especially with friends who are not good and how important it is to recognize them.

## SAINT JAMES PARISH

In the evening, John Rick Miller gave a talk at St. James Parish, located in the northern part of Miami, where the Pastor, Monsignor Jean Pierre, of Haitian origin, gave a warm welcome. In his talk, John Rick made historical reference to the fact that the USA was a country dedicated to the Virgin Mary, citing various names of states and rivers in the US that bear Marian references. John Rick Miller has made a commitment to incorporate the great Haitian community here in South Florida, a point that is being addressed now with the translation of the prayers of the Mission to the Creole language.

### **MEETING WITH BISHOP GERALD M. BARBARITO**

The morning of Saturday December 1, just a day or two after John arrived to Florida, he was invited to attend the mass of the "Damas Catolicas" in the Cathedral of St. Ignatius of Loyola in Palm Beach Gardens, Florida in which the Most Reverend Bishop Gerald M. Barbarito, presided the mass and John received his blessing. In this brief meeting John was able to speak about the Mission and to set up a formal meeting with the Bishop on his next visit to Florida. The Bishop was gracious enough to pose for a few pictures with John and his assistant. The office of the Bishop is very interested in the Mission and has approved of it since it was first presented in August 2009.



### **MEETING WITH PALM BEACH PRAYER GROUPS**

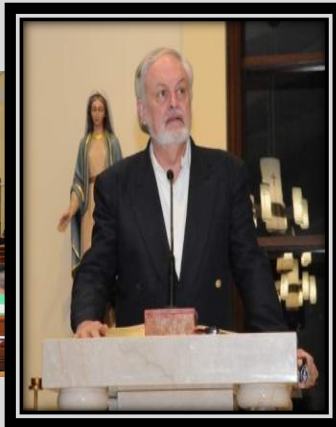
On December 1, members of Palm Beach's prayer groups of For the Love of God Worldwide met with John to hear his message and strategize on how the Mission will move forward recruiting new members and how to carry its message to more Catholics and churches. The meeting took place at the Holy Spirit Catholic Church, where the Mission has the endorsement of the Parish Priest. The Home Enthronement Program was also discussed and John was able to personally meet those who help with different tasks and belong to the Prayer Groups in Palm Beach County.



## HOLY CROSS CHURCH

On this same day, John Rick Miller opened his talk to the Anglo community of Indiantown, Florida, located in a quiet corner of Martin County, near Palm Beach. John Rick dared the community to get involved with their priest and to practice the values that make all of us Catholics.

After his first talk, he spoke to a large crowd of the Hispanic community of Indiantown, asking again for their participation in the Mission. The Relic Image towered over everyone when John spoke to the crowd, a simple reminder of humility, humbleness and how much can be accomplished with a little faith.



## ST. MARY CHURCH

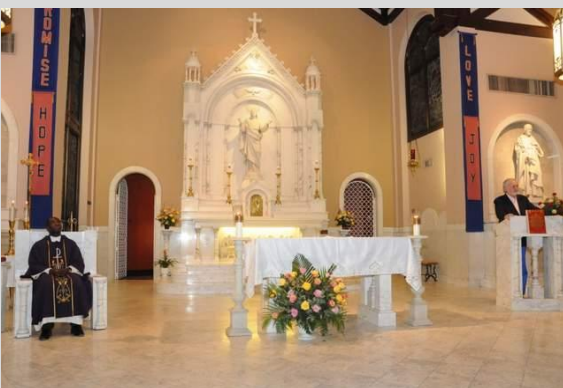
John started Sunday December 2 morning with his talk at the English mass in Pahokee, an agricultural town nested on the side of Lake Okeechobee. Its priest, Father John Mericantante, guides St. Mary, his new church. Approximately 500 parishioners were in attendance for the Initial Consecration Mass and his talk. John carried his message of conversion and to consecrate oneself and family to the two Hearts. Later John spoke to approximately 450 parishioners at the Spanish mass, most of them, migrant workers, on the importance of leading a life of prayer and conversion. A Consecration ceremony was performed by Father John in each mass for a total of almost 1,000 people consecrated.

The church opened its doors to the Mission.



## ST. ANN CHURCH

On December 2, John Rick spoke at a full house at St. Ann's Catholic Church after the Creole mass in downtown West Palm Beach. There were about 550 parishioners in attendance. In the mass he announced that he had started conversation with various people in the government to consecrate Haiti to the Immaculate Heart of Jesus and the Sorrowful Heart of Mary. These news were well received among the Haitian Community. Mr. Miller dared the public to become better Catholics and to challenge today's secularism in society. Mr. Miller also announced that the Mission was going to start the program of Home Enthronements with the Relic Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe





## HOLY SPIRIT CHURCH

On December 3, John Rick Miller returned to the Holy Spirit Church, accepting the invitation of Father Kevin Nelson to speak for a second time. John Rick carried his message of conversion and a life of prayer to all of those in attendance. This quiet seaside community was moved by his powerful message. He invited the public to live the true life of a Catholic by praying, works of mercy, having a true conversion and consecrating themselves and their families.



## MARY'S WORKSHOP



John Rick Miller visited a group of ladies that go by the name "The Workshop of Mary" in which they meet each week in a home to hand make rosaries and at the same time pray the Holy Rosary for the people who will receive them. The group is made up of women from different countries in the Spanish speaking world, and as such, in John Rick's talk there were many who expressed an interest in bringing the Mission back to their countries of origin in order to help make a change, especially in those countries where civil liberties are compromised.



## MEETING WITH THE MAYOR

On Tuesday, March 4, John Rick Miller and three members of the Mission met with another Mayor of a major city in the northern portion of South Florida. The Mayor expressed great interest in the Mission and is very open to consecrating his city after checking with his attorneys in order to ensure that there will not be any legal barrier.

## MEETING WITH THE COUNCIL

This same afternoon the members of the Council of the Mission in South Florida met with our Founder, John Rick Miller, as well as with some new people who are interested in taking a more active role in the Mission. Each person attending was introduced via a small summary of each person's responsibilities, achievements and goals within the Mission. John Rick encouraged us to continue, to be united and to focus on new communities, including: Haitian, Vietnamese, African-American, Indian, and those from the Caribbean Islands. He also explained that this mission is about helping people understand the Love of God through four simple steps (Consecration, Metanoia, Prayer from the Heart, and Good Works).



## OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

In the evening, John Rick Miller gave a talk at the Parish of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Doral, which is run by our Spiritual Advisor, Fr. Israel Mago. This talk was very special and was attended by approximately 120 people. Rick spoke of our Holy Father John Paul II, who had a deep relationship with Our Lady of Guadalupe; already very weak and tired from his years, he made his last trip to Mexico, against the recommendations of his doctors, and proclaimed to the world that the New Evangelization will come through the hands of Our Lady of Guadalupe. John Rick explained that with the Enthronement of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the homes, She will take care of each family and the first thing she will do is put on her apron and her rubber gloves and begin cleaning and sweeping the home.



## KEY BISCAVNE PRAYER GROUP

John Rick Miller visited a group organized by Ms. Ana Arellano on the small island of Key Biscayne, a group that meets weekly to pray the Holy Rosary. With an attendance of roughly 35 people, Rick asked that they analyze their confessions, since we mostly confess the same sins for each of us that are confessed again and again, and we need to try and improve upon these weaknesses; ask God to help us understand that we are his children. That way one day we may receive the gift of conversion and we will let the Holy Spirit enter our lives and feel the joy of the presence of God.



## RECORDING

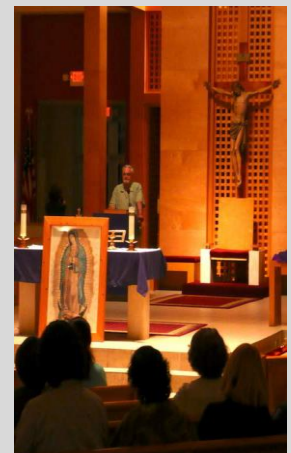
Immediately following the talk in Key Biscayne, John Rick Miller was taken to a studio in Aventura to finish recording material that will soon be available to the public.

## ST. AGATHA CATHOLIC CHURCH

With more than 200 people in attendance, John Rick Miller was received with open arms at this Parish, which a few days later participated in the Guadalupe Celebration organized by the Mission in the month of December. One of the themes that John Rick touched on in his talk is that our priests are under a great attack, because there is no faith on earth that has the Presence of Christ nor its Sacraments given directly by the Hand of God and that these are administered only by our priests. At the end of the talk, Rick humbly asked the blessing of Reverend Father Alexander Ekechukwu, Parochial Vicar of St. Agatha and who is of Haitian origin.



With this talk, John Rick Miller concluded his visit to South Florida. Almost the entire team was present to say goodbye to him with great joy and thanks.
