

#### **VERACRUZ**

On October 24<sup>th</sup> began the preparation for the Consecration of CRIT in Veracruz, with the participation of the collaborators and families in the daily recitation of the Holy Rosary. The Consecration Mass was celebrated on November 22<sup>nd</sup> at 12:00 p.m. and was presided by Msgr. Jorge Carlos Patron Wong and concelebrated by Fr. Manuel Rangel Arroyo.

There were over 400 attendees including collaborators, volunteers, families of patients and general public. Likewise present were the Director of Corporate Volunteerism, Cecilia Cansino, the Director General, the Sub director and the Coordinator of Volunteers in the CRIT of Tamaulipas. The Director General and the Operations Director as well as a patient read the prayers of Consecration representing each of the areas that were given unto God through the intercession of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Bishop then made the prayer of Consecration and gave way to the Enthronement of Our Lady of Guadalupe in the Chapel of CRIT.

The CRIT in Cancun and Guanajuato were also consecrated.

















### RENEWAL OF THE CONSECRATION OF THE ARCHDIOCESE OF ACAPULCO





On Saturday November 23<sup>rd</sup>, took place the Renewal of the Consecration of the Archdiocese of Acapulco and the State of Guerrero to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary at the Expo Forum Imperial World with the attendance of 10,000 people. The event began with the concert of "Open Sky" with Emmanuel Group, inviting the attendees to have a living encounter with the Blessed Sacrament. During the Eucharistic Celebration, Msgr. Carlos Garfias Merlos thank God for the Youth Mission renewed the Consecration of his Archdiocese and the state of Guerrero to the Two Hearts. The Chief Secretary to the Government, Jesus Martinez Garnelo, attended on behalf of the Governor accompanied by the Assistant Secretary for Religious Affairs, Jorge Alberto Gonzalez. Maria Concepcion Murillo, Director of Civil Registration of the City of Acapulco also attended the ceremony of Consecration on behalf of Mayor Luis Walton Aburto.











## CONSECRATION OF THE DIOCESE OF MAZATLAN

As part of the conclusion of the Year of the Faith on Sunday November 24<sup>th</sup>, the Bishop of Mazatlan Msgr. Mario Espinosa Contreras celebrated the Consecration of his Diocese to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Eucharist was held at 9:00 a.m. at the Cathedral with the participation of 600 faithful. 20 internal Parishes and 20 external as well as the Seminary and School of Mazatlan also carried out Masses of Consecration. In total 12,150 people made their initial consecration to the Two Hearts and November 24<sup>th</sup> was established as the date on which such consecration shall be renewed each year.



#### SAN LUIS SOYATLAN

On December 1<sup>st</sup> 2013, the town of San Luis Soyatlan in the state of Jalisco was consecrated. Fr. Joel Alberto Sanchez, celebrated the Mass in which 1,200 faithful, including representatives from each neighborhood, made their initial consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus and to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

#### **URUAPAN**

On Thursday December 12<sup>th</sup> the Parish of the Holy Trinity and its territory was consecrated to the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary. The Mass was presided by the Auxiliary Bishop of Zamora, Msgr. Jaime Calderon and concelebrated by parish priest Alfonso Vega and Fr. Sergio. 1,100 people attended of which 300 families took the image of Our Lad of Guadalupe to enthrone Her in their homes. Msgr. Calderon spoke of the importance of this Mission for the times we are living in Mexico, especially in the state of Michoacan. He fittingly read a document which was written by the bishops and the Archbishop of Morelia where they ask families to renew themselves in daily conversion, emphasizing the importance of prayer cenacles in order to receive the great gift of conversion which God will place in our hearts.
